

Saviour of the mothers: Ignac Semmelweis: doctors, wash your hand before you enter the delivery room (1818-1865)

Stress: Janos Selye, 1936

C-vitamin: Albert Szentgyörgyi Nobel prize 1937

Computer: John von Neumann (1904-1957) computers operate according to the Neumann Principle

Nuclear science: Ede Teller, Leo Szilárd, Jenő Wigner core scientists of the Manhattan Plan (Second World War, the nuclear bomb)
